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1 Introduction

ViPlex Handy is a screen management app for Android and iOS phones, which allows you to manage various devices such as the Taurus series multimedia players and the JT100 traffic multimedia player.

Features:

- Friendly user interface: UI design takes user habits into full consideration.
- Ease of use: Devices can be connected and easily accessed via wireless networks.
- Synchronous playback: Allows the same content to be played on different screens synchronously.
- Smart brightness adjustment: Allows for automatic and scheduled brightness adjustment.
- Dual Wi-Fi functionality: Supports Wi-Fi AP and Wi-Fi Sta.
- 4G connection: Devices with 4G modules support mobile networks.
- Dual-mode (synchronous and asynchronous): Allows you to set video output mode.
- Auto fit to screen: Capable of automatically scaling content to fit the screen.
- A new remote publishing mode: Allows solutions to be published to cloud devices via the Internet.

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3 Local Devices

3.1 Device Connection


Scenarios

This chapter introduces how to connect ViPlex Handy to the Taurus via the Wi-Fi AP of the Taurus.

Operating Procedure

Step 1 Open ViPlex Handy.


Figure 3-1 Device list



Step 2 At the top right, tap ?. Read the on-screen instructions and then tap **Next**.

The WLAN screen is displayed.

Step 3 Connect to the Wi-Fi AP of the Taurus.

The default SSID is "AP+Last 8 digits of SN" and the default password is "12345678".

Figure 3-3 Wi-Fi connection




Go back to ViPlex Handy. Refresh the device list and do the following according to the status of the Taurus. Step 4

ViPlex Handy automatically detects the Taurus and refreshes the device list. You can also swipe down to refresh the device list manually.

- Denotes that the Taurus is offline and cannot be connected.
- : Denotes that the Taurus is online and can be connected. Go to Step 5.

- Step 5 Tap Connect next to a screen name.
- Step 6 Enter the password (defaults to "123456") for the "admin" user and then tap **OK**.

Upon successful connection, is displayed. ViPlex Handy saves the account information automatically.

Related Operations

- After successful connection, if the password is verified as a weak password, a prompt will be displayed, reminding you to change the password. Do any of the following:
 - Tap Ignore Once if you do not want to change the password.
 - Tap **Change Password** to change the device password and hotspot password.
- When the Taurus is online, tap
 to do the following:
 - Bind to Cloud: Tap to quickly bind the local device to the VNNOX cloud platform. (This option is displayed only after the device has been successfully connected.)
 - Connect: Tap to connect to the Taurus.
 - Forget Password: Clear the device login password automatically saved by ViPlex Handy. (This option is displayed only after the device has been successfully connected.)
- After the Taurus is connected, tap to do the following:
 - Control: Tap to access the Device Management page. For details, see 3.2 Device Management.
 - Bind to Cloud: Tap to quickly bind the local device to the VNNOX cloud platform.
 - Disconnect: Tap to disconnect the Taurus.
 - Rename: Tap to change the device name.
 - Delete: Tap to remove the device from the local device list.

Notes:

- All the offline, online (successfully connected before) and connected devices on the Local Devices page can be bound to the cloud.
- Before binding a device to the cloud, connect your phone to the Internet and then follow the on-screen instructions to register an account or log in to the VNNOX cloud platform.

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3.2 Device Management

3.2.1 Screen Configuration


Scenarios

To make a screen display content correctly, you need to configure the screen to connect receiving cards logically after setting up the LED display control system.

Prerequisites

- The corresponding local device is connected. For details, see 3 Local Devices.
- This function is available when the system is in screen configuration mode.
 As shown in Figure 3-5, select Screen Configuration Mode next to Select Mode on the Me page.

Figure 3-5 Screen configuration mode




Operating Procedure

- Step 1 On the **Local Devices** page, tap a device name, or tap next to the device name and choose **Control** to access the device management page.
- Step 2 Choose **Screen Configuration** to access the screen configuration page.

If it is the first time to do screen configuration for the current device, as shown in Figure 3-6, a 400×400-px receiving card will be displayed by default. If screen configuration has been done for the device before, the configured receiving cards and connection will be displayed.

Figure 3-6 Screen configuration page




ViPlex Handy automatically obtains and displays all the Ethernet ports of the current device, including the backup ports. As shown in Figure 3-6, 1 2 3 4 represent the four Ethernet ports of the current device.

- Step 3 Tap RV Card Settings at the upper right of the page.
- Step 4 On the **RV Card Settings** page, set the columns and rows of receiving cards and the loading capacity per receiving card according to the actual conditions.

As shown in Figure 3-7, there are two rows and columns of receiving cards, and the loading capacity per receiving card is 128×128 px.

Notes:

- The columns or rows of receiving cards must be an integer ranging from 1 to 600, and the width or height must be an integer ranging from 16 to 1024.
- The total loading capacity of all the receiving cards cannot exceed the maximum loading capacity of the current device.

Step 5 After the settings, tap **OK** at the top right to go back to the screen configuration page. As shown in Figure 3-8, the four squares represent the four receiving cards set in the previous step.

Step 6 Select an Ethernet port, then use your finger to slide across the centers of the receiving cards to be loaded by the Ethernet port to connect the receiving cards. Ethernet ports 3 and 4 are backup ports and receiving card connection is not allowed.

As shown in Figure 3-9, after receiving card connection is completed, the color of the receiving cards loaded by each Ethernet port is the same as the color of the Ethernet port. The corresponding Ethernet port number is displayed at the top left of each receiving card, for example, "1-2" denotes the second receiving card loaded by Ethernet port 1.

On the **Screen Configuration** page, you can also do the following if needed.

Select receiving cards

Tap a receiving card to select it. Tap and slide on any border of the selected receiving card to select more receiving cards.

Change receiving card position and loading capacity

Select one or more receiving cards and tap to change the position coordinates and the width and height of the loading capacity. You can also change the position by dragging the selected receiving card(s).

- The width or height of the loading capacity of the receiving card(s) must be an integer ranging from 16 to 1024.
- Receiving cards cannot be placed outside the canvas.



Zoom

Tap \bigcirc or \bigcirc to zoom out or in on the canvas, or pinch to zoom.

Undo actions

At the bottom of the page, tap $\begin{cases} \begin{cases} \begin{cases$

Delete receiving cards

Select one or more receiving cards and tap at the bottom of the page to delete the selected receiving card(s). If the system version of the current device is earlier than V3.5.0, receiving cards cannot be deleted and the icon will not be displayed.

• Delete connection lines

At the bottom of the page, tap to delete the receiving card connection lines.

Notes:

- Receiving card connection is not allowed for backup Ethernet ports.
- If the system version of the device is earlier than V3.5.0, the receiving cards cannot be selected, dragged and deleted, and receiving card position and loading capacity cannot be edited on the **Screen Configuration** page.

Step 7 After the screen configuration is completed, tap **Done**.

3.2.2 Multi-Screen Mosaic

Scenarios


Multi-screen mosaic is available in screen configuration mode.

This function allows multiple screens with the same specification to be spliced for image mosaic. Screens can be spliced horizontally from the left to right only.

Prerequisites


 The hardware connection is done. For example, splice three T6 units and use an external video source, as shown in Figure 3-10.

- The corresponding local devices are connected.
- This function is available when the system is in screen configuration mode.


Figure 3-11 Screen configuration mode

 As shown in Figure 3-11, select Screen Configuration Mode next to Select Mode on the Me page.

Operating Procedure

Step 1 On the **Local Devices** page, tap at the top right.

Step 2 Enter a resolution loaded by a unit and tap **Query** to search for screens.


The online devices and offline devices with mosaic orders that match your query will be displayed.

- Step 3 (Optional) Tap = to sort the devices with mosaic order by ascending mosaic order.
- Step 4 Tap Mosaic to access the Mosaic Settings page.

Step 5 Set the number of screens used for the mosaic.

The number of screens cannot be greater than the ceiling integer of the value of "video source width / loading capacity width of a device".

- Step 6 Set mosaic order.
- Step 7 Set the video source of the first screen to the internal source or HDMI.
- Step 8 (Optional) Tap 🕙 to delete the sequence number of a screen, and this screen will not be used for the mosaic.
- Step 9 Tap OK.

3.2.3 Device Control

Scenarios

Users can remotely control screens in real time or as scheduled and configure time synchronization for devices.

Prerequisites


The corresponding device is connected.

Operating Procedure

Step 1 On the **Local Devices** page, tap the device name to access the **Device management** page, as shown in Figure 3-15.

You can drag a function module to change its position.

Step 2 Tap a function icon to access its function page.

The description of each function is shown in Table 3-1.

Quick Control	Time Zone	Allows you to set the UTC time zone.
	Time	Displays the corresponding time of the time zone you set.
	Adjust Volume	Allows you to drag the slider or tap the volume up and down buttons to adjust the volume.

Step 3 Do the following as required.

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Go to Screen Settings > Brightness Control. During smart brightness adjustment settings, set automatic
brightness adjustment parameters if Auto Brightness Adjustment is selected. Within the time range you set,
the screen brightness changes automatically according to the auto brightness adjustment parameter table.

Figure 3-16 Automatic brightness adjustment rules




Figure 3-17 Automatic brightness adjustment table




- Go to Advanced Settings > Time Synchronization. Select a time synchronization mode and configure the relevant parameters, then tap Done.
 - NTP time synchronization: Select an NTP server as the time reference. You can add custom servers.

RF time synchronization: Set a group ID and set the current device as the master device or a slave device.
 To synchronize the time of the master device with an NTP server, enable Auto Time Synchronization and set an NTP server.





Figure 3-21 Binding to iCare

 Remote Management: Connect to VNNOX Standard/AD and iCare. The authentication information is required during the configuration, as shown in Figure 3-20 and Figure 3-21.

To view the authentication information, log in to VNNOX (www.vnnox.com) and choose > Player Authentication at the top right of the page.

Figure 3-20 Binding to VNNOX Standard/AD

- Step 2 Tap Cloud Devices.
 - If you have not logged in to the VNNOX cloud platform. Go to Step 3.
 - If you have logged in to the VNNOX cloud platform. Go to Step 4.


Figure 4-1 Cloud devices (not logged in)

Figure 4-3 Logged in to VNNOX





Figure 4-4 Binding the device to cloud

The local device is quickly bound to the VNNOX cloud platform.

Step 6 View cloud devices.

- Bound: Devices that are bound to the cloud.
- Binding: Devices that are not bound to the cloud yet after you complete the operations of binding devices to the cloud.

Figure 4-5 Cloud devices (bound to the cloud)




Figure 4-6 Cloud devices (being bound to the cloud)


To edit, publish and play solutions normally, complete the following settings on iOS 11.0 or later in advance.

- Camera: Settings > Camera > Formats > Most Compatible

Operating Procedure

- Step 1 On the **Solution List** page, select the **Local Solutions** tab.
- Step 2 Tap + to add a solution.





Figure 5-4 Solution layout



Step 7 Set media properties.

The properties of different types of media vary. Figure 5-6 shows the properties of an analog clock.

Step 8 (Optional) Tap 🔁 to continue adding media to the selected area.

Multiple media items can be added simultaneously. Media items are played in order from front to back. You can drag a media item to change its playback order.

Step 9 (Optional) Tap x at the top right of a media icon to delete the media.

Step 10 If the solution contains:

- Multiple areas, repeat Step 5 to Step 9 to edit all the areas in the solution.
- One area, go to Step 11.

Step 11 After the solution editing is done, do the following as required.

• Tap to save the solution.

If the solution contains cloud media, saving the solution will download the cloud media to the local storage. (The media downloaded before will not be downloaded again and the phone must be connected to the Internet.)

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Tap , select one or more devices and then tap Publish.
 The devices refers to the connected local devices only.

5.1.2 Publishing Solutions

Prerequisites

The corresponding device is connected.

Related Information

After the solution editing is done, tap $\sqrt{}$ to publish the solution. For details, see 5.1.1 Editing Solutions. In other situations, do the following to publish a solution.

Operating Procedure

Step 1 On the **Solution List** page, select the **Local Solutions** tab.

If there is not enough disk space in the device, the software will remind you of insufficient disk space and instruct you to clear all the media in the disk. Solutions cannot be published if the media is not cleared.

5.1.3 Uploading Solutions to Cloud

Upload local solutions to the cloud to meet a variety of application requirements.

Prerequisites

- Your phone is connected to the Internet.
- You have logged in to the VNNOX cloud platform in ViPlex Handy.
- Your VNNOX account has permission to create/edit solutions.

Related Information

After a solution is edited, you can tap and select **Save & Upload to Cloud** to directly upload the solution to the cloud. For details, see 5.1.1 Editing Solutions. For other situations, do the following to upload solutions to the cloud.

Step 1 On the Solution List page, select the Local Solutions tab.

Upload images and videos to the cloud media library, and view and delete the images and videos. The cloud media library refers to the media contents in VNNOX Standard.

- Your phone is connected to the Internet.
- You have logged in to the VNNOX cloud platform in ViPlex Handy.
- Your VNNOX account has permission related to the media library.

Operating Procedure

Step 1 On the Solution List page, tap Cloud Media at the top right.

The Cloud Media Library page is displayed.

7.1 How to check the version of ViPlex Handy?

- Step 1 Go to Me > Help.
- Step 2 View the version of ViPlex Handy.

7.2 How to check the firmware version of a device?

- Step 1 Connect to a local device.
 - For detailed operations, see 3 Local Devices.
- Step 2 On the Local Devices page, tap the device name to access the Device Management page.
- Step 3 Tap Device Information.
- Step 4 View the software version and sub-software version of the device.

7.3 How to upgrade the firmware version of a device?

Strategy

- If the firmware version of a device is earlier than V2.3.0, it must be upgraded to V2.3.0 before upgraded to the latest version.
- If the firmware version of a device is V2.3.0 or later, it can be upgraded directly to the latest version.

Note:

• If a device earlier than V1.2.8 is connected to ViPlex Handy, a prompt saying the firmware version is too old will be displayed and instruct you to upgrade the firmware of the device. If you choose not to upgrade the firmware, you cannot continue using ViPlex Handy.

Operating Procedure

- Step 1 Open ViPlex Handy.
- Step 2 Choose Me > Firmware Management to access the Firmware Management page.
- Step 3 Connect your phone to a Wi-Fi network with Internet access or turn on mobile data. ViPlex Handy automatically displays the firmware upgrade packages of different models of devices, as shown in Figure 7-1.

If the required firmware upgrade package has been downloaded before, go to Step 5.

Figure 7-1 Firmware management




Step 4 Do any of the following to download the required firmware upgrade package.

- Tap the download button next to the required upgrade package.
- Tap **Search by device**, select the target device, and tap **OK** to filter out the upgrade packages of the device quickly, then tap \bigcirc next to an upgrade package.

After the download is completed, turns into a **Use** button, as shown in Figure 7-2. You can tap **Downloaded** at the top right of the page to delete downloaded upgrade packages.

Step 5 Tap **Use** next to the upgrade package of the target version to send the package to the target device.

 If you have filtered out the required upgrade package, the target device will be connected automatically after you tap Use.

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- If you have not filtered the upgrade packages, the recently connected devices will be displayed after you tap Use. Select the target device and tap Upgrade.
- If device connection fails or no devices are found, manually connect your phone to the Wi-Fi AP of the target device and then tap Use.


After the firmware package is sent successfully, the device will be upgraded and restarted automatically. Then, reconnect to the device in Local Devices.

7.4 How to bind a device to the cloud?

Problem Description

After you complete the operation of binding a device to the cloud, it is not bound to the cloud and displayed on the Binding page, as shown in Figure 7-3.

Possible Causes

- The device is not connected to the Internet.
- The device and phone are not on the same LAN. (This is required when the device system version is earlier than V2.3.0.)
- The device is already bound to the cloud.

Remedies

Scenario 1: The device system version is earlier than V2.3.0 and a Retry button appears next to the device name on the Binding page.

Notes:

- Method A: See 7.3 How to upgrade the firmware version of a device? to upgrade the device system to the latest version and try again.
- Method B: See Step 1 to Step 2.

Check whether the device is connected to the Internet. Step 1

- If the device has Internet access, go to Step 2.
- If the device has no Internet access, connect it to the Internet and then check whether it is bound to the cloud.
 - If the device is successfully bound to the cloud, no further action will be required.

If the device is not bound to the cloud, go to Step 2.

Step 2 Check whether the device and phone are on the same LAN.

- If they are on the same LAN, tap **Retry**.
- If they are not on the same LAN, connect the device and phone to the same Internet and tap Retry.
- Scenario 2: The device system version is V2.3.0 or later and a Retry button appears next to the device name on the Binding page.

Step 1 Tap View.



- Step 2 Follow the on-screen instructions to connect the device to the Internet.
 - Scenario 3: Failed to bind to cloud is displayed under the device name on the Binding page.
- Step 1 Check whether the device is already bound to the cloud.
 - If the device is already bound to the cloud, no further action will be required.
 - If the device is not bound to the cloud, go to Step 2.
- Step 2 On the **Binding** page, delete the device.
- Step 3 Repeat the operations of binding a device to the cloud.

For the operations of binding a device to the cloud, see the relevant steps in 3 Local Devices and 4 Cloud Devices.

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
