

## VNNOX One-Stop Cloud Platform

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## About This Document

The cloud publishing service of VNNOX one-stop cloud platform includes VNNOX Standard and VNNOX AD, allowing for remote content management and terminal control. In the self-built system, VNNOX Standard is not supported.

This document introduces the functions of VNNOX Standard to help users to understand and use the product. Below is an introduction of related concepts.

#### Remote Publishing

Remote publishing enables users to publish solutions associated with players to remote terminal players via Internet. The solutions will be downloaded and played by terminal players as scheduled.

#### Remote Control

Remote control enables users to perform real-time or scheduled operations such as restarting players. Scheduled control can be implemented by sending remote control plans.

#### **Players**

Players include synchronous players and asynchronous players, which can be associated with solutions and remote control plans.

Players in VNNOX Standard are created automatically when bound to the terminal player and can be transferred to VNNOX AD by authorization.

Players in VNNOX AD are created manually on the player list page and require licenses.

In the self-built system, VNNOX Standard and functions related to licenses are not supported.

#### **Terminal Players**

Solutions can be downloaded and played by terminal players as scheduled.

VPlayer is an application which serves as a terminal player and can be used for devices installed with Windows.

Taurus series multimedia players are hardware products based on Android and can be used as the terminal players of the asynchronous system.

#### **Player Binding**

Player binding is also called terminal binding.

Binding terminal players to players enables users to publish solutions and control displays remotely. Only one player can be bound to a terminal player.

- Synchronous players: Bound to VPlayer
- Asynchronous players: Bound to Taurus with ViPlex

ViPlex includes ViPlex Handy (Android and iOS) and ViPlex Express (Windows).


#### Solutions

In VNNOX Standard, after users add media and edit the solution page, a solution is created. In the self-built system, VNNOX Standard is not supported.

In VNNOX AD, after users add media, add media and sub-playlists to a playlist and schedule the playlist, a solution is created.

The relationship between the media, playlist and solution is shown in Figure 1-1.

## 2 Software Installation

## 2.1 Installing VPlayer

#### Before You Begin

- Visit www.en.vnnox.com/#downloadSyn to download the VPlayer installation program.
- Make sure the antivirus software is stopped.
- Make sure the .NET Framework V4.0 or above is installed.

#### **Installing Software**

The installation of VPlayer is the same as other Windows applications.

## 2.2 Installing ViPlex

ViPlex includes ViPlex Handy and ViPlex Express.

## 2.2.1 Installing ViPlex Handy (Android and iOS)

#### **Downloading Installation Package**

Scan the QR code below to download the installation packages for Android and iOS.



#### Installing Software

The installation of the ViPlex Handy is the same as other applications.

# 3 System Login

- Step 1 Visit www.en.vnnox.com and click **Login** at the top right of the page.
- Step 2 Select the server node and click **OK**.
- Step 3 Enter the account name and password, then click **Log In**. The service login page is displayed.

Step 4 Click any position of the image of VNNOX Standard to enter its homepage.

When you enter VNNOX Standard for the first time, the default system setting prompt is displayed. After you set VNNOX Standard as the default system, the homepage of VNNOX Standard will be displayed directly when you click **Log In**.

# 4 Solution Publishing

## 4.1 Checking Player Authentication Information

#### **Related Information**

After successful registration, VNNOX generates the default authentication information automatically.

To prevent terminal players from illegally accessing VNNOX, you are advised to change the default authentication information.

#### **Operating Steps**

- Step 1 Choose > Player Authentication to jump to the Player Authentication page of cloud platform.
- Step 2 Record VNNOX Standard/AD Authentication Information.
- Step 3 (Optional) Click **Copy** on the right of **VNNOX Standard/AD Authentication Information** to copy the authentication information to the required place.

## 4.2 Creating Players

By using ViPlex Express (V1.8.0 or later) and VPlayer (V3.2.0 or later), terminals can be directly bound to VNNOX Standard/AD without the need to create players in VNNOX Standard/AD.

Players in VNNOX Standard are created automatically when bound to terminal players or are transferred from VNNOX AD.

After players are created successfully, information related to the players will be displayed on the **Players** page. Users can perform the following operations.


- Update player status
- Transfer players to VNNOX AD
- Rename players
- Upgrade terminal players
- Delete players
- Group players

## 4.2.1 Creating Players with VPlayer

Step 1 Open VPlayer, as shown in Figure 4-1.

- Step 2 Select a server address. Player name defaults to terminal name and can be edited by users.
- Step 3 Enter the authentication user name and password which must be consistent with those in VNNOX.
- Step 4 Click **Get** and then click **OK** to close the prompt box. **Bind and create player** will be displayed in the drop-down options.
- Step 5 Click OK.

After the player is bound successfully, The server connection is successful is displayed at the bottom left of the page.

### 4.2.2 Creating Players with ViPlex

## 4.2.2.1 ViPlex Handy (Android and iOS)

#### Before You Begin

- Get the SSID and password of WiFi AP of the Taurus. The default SSID is "AP+the last 8 digits". The default password is "12345678".
- Get the password of the user "admin". The default password of the user "admin" is "123456".
- Connect the Taurus to Internet.

#### **Operating Steps**

- Step 1 Connect to the WiFi AP of the Taurus products.
- Step 2 Start ViPlex Handy.

ViPlex Handy automatically detects the Taurus and refreshes the screen list. Users can also swipe down to manually refresh the screen list.

- Denotes that the Taurus is online and you can log in to it. Go to Step 3.
- Denotes that Taurus is offline and you cannot log into it.
- Step 3 Tap **Connect** next to the screen name.
- Step 4 Enter the password for the "admin" user and then tap **Login**.

After successful login, is displayed. ViPlex Handy saves the account information automatically.

- Step 5 Tap a screen name to enter the **Screen management** page.
- Step 6 Select Remote Management > Player Binding.



- Step 7 Select a server. Enter the authentication user name and password of the player. The authentication information must be consistent with the authentication information in VNNOX.
- Step 8 Tap **Obtain** and select **Bind and create player** from the drop-down box.
- Step 9 Tap OK.

#### 4.2.2.2 ViPlex Express (Windows)

#### Before You Begin

- Get the SSID and password of WiFi AP of the Taurus. The default SSID is "AP+the last 8 digits". The default password is "12345678".
- Get the password of the user "admin". The default password of the user "admin" is "123456".
- Connect the Taurus to Internet.

#### **Operating Steps**

- Step 1 Connect to the WiFi AP of the Taurus products.
- Step 2 Start ViPlex Express.
- Step 3 Click **Refresh** to refresh the screen list.


After detecting the Taurus, ViPlex Express will try to log in to the Taurus with the default account or the account used for last login.

- Denotes that the Taurus is online and you can log in to it. Go to Step 4.
- Denotes the Taurus is offline and you cannot log into it.
- Denotes logging into the Taurus is successful.

Step 4 Click Connect on the right of the screen information.

- Step 5 Enter the password for the "admin" user and then click **OK**.

  After successful login, ViPlex Express saves the account information automatically.
- Step 6 Select Screen Control.
- Step 7 Click Server configuration.
- Step 8 Select the target terminal in the terminal list.



- Step 9 Select a server. Player name defaults to terminal name and can be edited by users. Hold down the **Shift** button and select multiple terminals to bind terminals in batches.
- Step 10 Enter the authentication user name and password of the player. The authentication information must be consistent with the authentication information in VNNOX.
- Step 11 Click Bind.

## 4.3 Adding Media

#### Related Information

Media types supported by VNNOX Standard are shown in Table 4-1. The total media storage space is 5 GB.

When a video cannot meet the decoding specifications of some asynchronous players, a corresponding prompt is displayed in the media list. Users can view the details to handle the problem.

#### **Operating Steps**

- Step 1 Choose Content.
- Step 2 Click Add media.
- Step 3 Select and open the media

## 4.4 Creating Solutions

- Step 1 Choose Solutions.
- Step 2 Click New.
- Step 3 Set the name and resolution of the solution and click **OK**. Solution editing page will displayed, as shown in Figure 4-2. The introduction of the editing page is detailed in Table 4-2.

Figure 4-2 Solution editing page



Step 4 After the solution is edited, click **Save**.

## 4.5 Publishing Solutions

After a solution is edited, click **Publish** to publish it. In other situations, you can perform the following operations to publish a solution.

If a solution contains videos that cannot meet the decoding specifications, there will be playback risks. For example, the videos will be automatically skipped or the playback effect will be unsatisfactory.

- Step 1 Choose Solutions.
- Step 2 Click of a corresponding solution.
- Step 3 Select one or multiple players and click **OK**.
- Step 4 Perform any of the following operations to view the publishing progress and result.
  - Choose Players and view the Solution column.
  - At the top right of the page, click

## **5** Other Functions

## 5.1 Player Transfer

Players in VNNOX Standard can be transferred to VNNOX AD.

- Step 1 Choose Players.
- Step 2 Select one or more players and click **Transfer to VNNOX AD** to transfer the players to VNNOX AD.

## 5.2 Terminal Player Upgrade

Users can upgrade the software versions of terminal players.

- Step 1 Choose Players.
- Step 2 Click 4.
  - is displayed when the software is the latest or is being upgraded.
- Step 3 Click OK.
- Step 4 In the **Details** column, view the upgrade progress.
- Step 5 View the software version after the upgrade is done.
  - Synchronous player: The version of VPlayer is displayed.
  - Asynchronous player: The software version of Taurus is displayed.
    - Software: Displays the versions of the Android application and FPGA program.
    - System: Displays the version of the Android OS.

## 5.3 Player Grouping

Users can implement grouping management for players.

- Step 1 Choose Players.
- Step 2 Click Grouping Management.
- Step 3 Move your mouse to a group name, click and select **New Group**.
- Step 4 Enter a new group name.

- Step 5 Find and select the players to be added to the new group.
- Step 6 Click **Move to Group**, select the new group from the drop-down box and click **OK**.

### 5.4 Remote Real-Time Control

Users can remotely control screen brightness, volume, video source, screen status, power and synchronous playback in real time and can restart and monitor terminal players.

- Step 1 Choose Player Control.
- Step 2 Click an icon to enter the corresponding page.

- Step 3 On the left of the page, select the target online players.
- Step 4 (Optional) On the right of the page, view real-time brightness, volume, video source, screen status or power status.

If multiple players are selected, only the real time status of the first player will be displayed.

- Step 5 Perform the following operations based on the actual situation.
  - To restart players, click Restart Now.
  - For the monitoring function, click **Media Cleanup**. If users choose to clean up the media that is being played at the same time, the screen may go black.
  - For other functions, set the parameters and click Apply.

### 5.5 Remote Scheduled Control

Users can add scheduled control plans to adjust brightness and volume, switch video sources, restart players, control screen status and control power supplies as scheduled.

When a player is transferred to VNNOX AD, the scheduled control data of the player will be also transferred automatically.

- Step 1 Choose Player Control.
- Step 2 Click a function icon to enter the corresponding page.

- Step 3 On the left of the page, select an online target player.
- Step 4 Perform the following operations in **Scheduled Control** according to the actual conditions.
  - Create a plan: Click to set command parameters and then click OK.
  - Change a plan: Select a plan, click , change command parameters, and then click **OK**.
  - Delete a plan: select one or multiple plans and click
  - Enable a plan: Set the toggle button to

Step 5 Click Apply.

## 5.6 Time Synchronization

Users can sync the time of terminal players via the time synchronization function.

- Step 1 Choose Player Control.
- Step 2 Click Time Synchronization.
- Step 3 On the left of the page, select the online players that require time synchronization.
- Step 4 Select a time synchronization method as required and configure the relevant parameters.

Step 5 Click Apply.

## 5.7 Playback Management

Users can capture screenshots when terminal players are playing images to check whether the playback is normal.

- Step 1 Choose Player Control.
- Step 2 Click Playback Management.
- Step 3 Select a player on the left.
- Step 4 Click Recapture.

After a screenshot is captured, the screenshot, date and time when it is captured and solution source will be displayed.

## 5.8 Remote Control Logs

Users can view the logs of terminal players executing remote real-time and scheduled control commands including the commands sent by VNNOX and the brightness control, volume control and power control commands sent by ViPlex.

- Step 1 Choose Logs > Remote Control Logs.
- Step 2 Click **Please select** to select one or more players.
- Step 3 Select a control command type.
- Step 4 (Optional) Click **Advanced Search** to set more search criteria.
- Step 5 Click Search.

## 5.9 Play Logs

Users can view play logs, including overview and details.

- Step 1 Choose Logs > Play Logs.
- Step 2 Click Player and select one or more players.

To view the overviews of play logs, up to 50 players can be selected. To view the details of play logs, up to 25 players can be selected.

- Step 3 Set search criteria and click Search.
  - Log type: Choose to search for the overviews or details of play logs.
  - Date range: You can search for the logs of the last three months. The start date and end date cannot be set to the current day and the range cannot be longer than 30 days.
  - Keyword: Click Advanced Search to display this parameter. You can search for a play log by entering a media name.

## 5.10 System Switching

Users can switch between the VNNOX homepage, VNNOX Standard, VNNOX AD and iCare.

- Step 1 Move your mouse to at the top left.
- Step 2 Select an option from the drop-down box to switch to the corresponding service.

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
